Black History Month began as a way of remembering events important people of African and Afro-Caribbean ancestry. The catalyst for Black History Month was created in 1926 in the United States. when Carter G. Woodson and the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH) announced "Negro History Week" in February, becoming a month-long celebration in 1970. 4th Annual Seed Swap!

Swap | Feb. 21 | 2:00PM - 4:00PM Quincy Public Library is hosting its fourth annual Seed Swap to help you diversify your garden with new herbs, vegetables, and flowers. Whether you have leftover seeds from last year, extra seeds from starting your spring plants, or packs you decided not to use, you can drop them off at the library and pick up new varieties on Seed Swap Day. Seed Drop-off Instructions:

- Bring your seeds in their original packaging. Open packets are welcome as long as they are resealed with tape or staples and placed in a small plastic bag.
- Drop them off at the Ask Here Desk, where staff will record your name and the number of packets you brought.
- Seed drop-off is available any time the library is open: Monday through Thursday 9 am to 8 pm and Friday 9 am to 5 pm.
- Swaps follow a one to one system. For every packet you bring, you will receive a packet to select on Seed Swap Day.

Seed Swap Day:

Join us on February 21 between 10 am and 12 pm to choose your new seeds. You may also bring seeds the day of the swap, but early drop-offs receive priority entry with a ticket. The drop-off and swap events are designed to help you explore new varieties and discover seeds you may never have tried before. Keep an eye on our calendar for an upcoming plant swap in April and visit our expanded Seed Library if you need even more seeds for your garden.

Week 1, March 6: Into the Fire: American Women in the Spanish Civil War

This documentary follows nearly 80 American women who volunteered 1936 in to support medical. humanitarian, and communications efforts during the Spanish Civil War. stories illustrate Their motivations, risks. and courage participating involved in in

international conflict far from home.



Week 2, March 13: Women of World War II: The Untold Stories

Through firsthand accounts and archival interviews, this film explores the contributions of women who worked as codebreakers, pilots, shipbuilders, and factory workers during World War II, illuminating the essential roles they played on the home front and beyond.



Week 3, March 20: Lee

A historical drama based on the life of correspondent and war photographer Lee Miller (Kate Winslet). The film follows her work alongside Allied troops during World War II as she documents events on the front lines and shapes public understanding of the conflict through her images.

Week 4, March 27: The Invisible War Directed Kirby Dick, by investigative documentary examines the issue of sexual assault within the U.S. military. The film presents reporting, interviews. perspectives that brought national attention to the topic and sparked discussions about policy institutional reform.

The drop-off period is between Monday, March 16 at 9 a.m. and Friday, March 20 at 5 p.m. Or just bring your trades in on swap day! You can arrive the day of the swap with items to trade, but people who drop off in advance and have a ticket will receive priority admittance on swap day—so don't miss out! Come join us and find your new crafting hobby!

*Swaps will be on a 1:1 basis, so keep this in mind. If you donate something with a higher value—like a sewing machine—you may not be able to pick out something of equal value on swap day.

FOURTH ANNUAL MENSTRUAL HYGIENE DRIVE

It's that time of year - QPL will hold its Fourth Annual Menstrual Hygiene Drive from Monday, March 2 until Friday, April 10!

Period Poverty is a human rights issue that affects all menstruating individuals regardless of race, nationality, and religion. It includes:

- Lack of menstrual hygiene supplies
- Lack of education surrounding menstruation
- Missing school, work, and other activities
- Exacerbates medical access for trans community

According to an article published in the Journal of Global Health Reports, "Two-thirds of the 16.9 million low-income women in the US could not afford menstrual products in the past year, with a half of this needing to choose between menstrual products and food."

Last year, your generosity provided 312 packages of pads, tampons, period underwear, menstrual cups, and hygiene wipes to Bella Ease, the YWCA, Quanada, Parents as Teachers through Transitions, Horizons, and the Quincy Public Schools! Let's see if we can top that this year!

- Pads
- Unused menstrual cups
- Unused period underwear

of their biological parents, discover each other for the first time at summer camp and make a plan to bring their parents back wayward together. This movie is rated PG and runs for 128 mins.




Program: Popsicle Tween Stick **Picture Frame Decorating** February 19 | 6PM - 7:30PM
