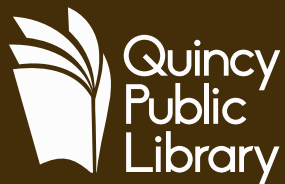

## Friends Book Sale

Purchase books at bargain prices at the Friends of the Quincy Public Library semi-annual sale, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, October 3, 4, and 5.

Library cards are not required to buy books at the sale.

Choose from thousands of books: fiction, non-fiction, paperbacks, and hardback. Most books are priced at 50 cents an inch. (Books will be stacked up and the height of the stack is measured.)

Come to the sale early for the best selection, and then visit again on Saturday, when the books are half price.

All proceeds from the book sale will be used by the Friends of the Library to support library services and programs.

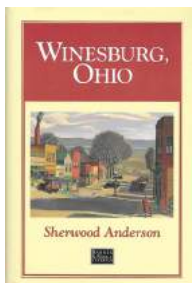
### ALL OVER THE PAGE

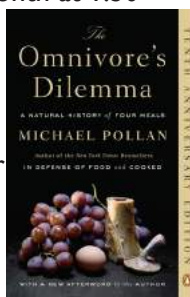
### RENAISSANCE READERS

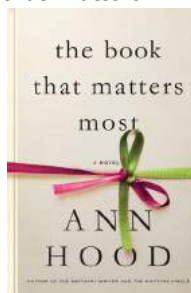
### LITERARY ANGLES

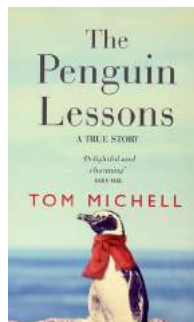
### UNSHELVED

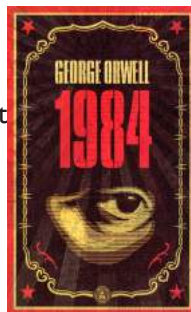
### BOOKIES

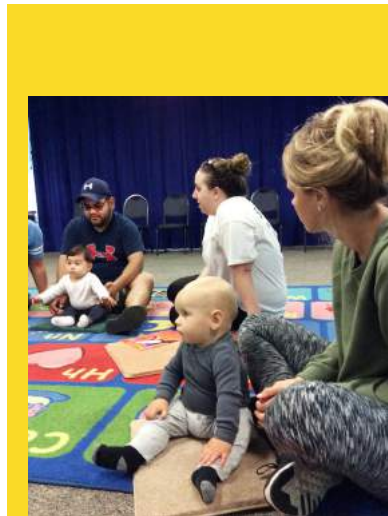
