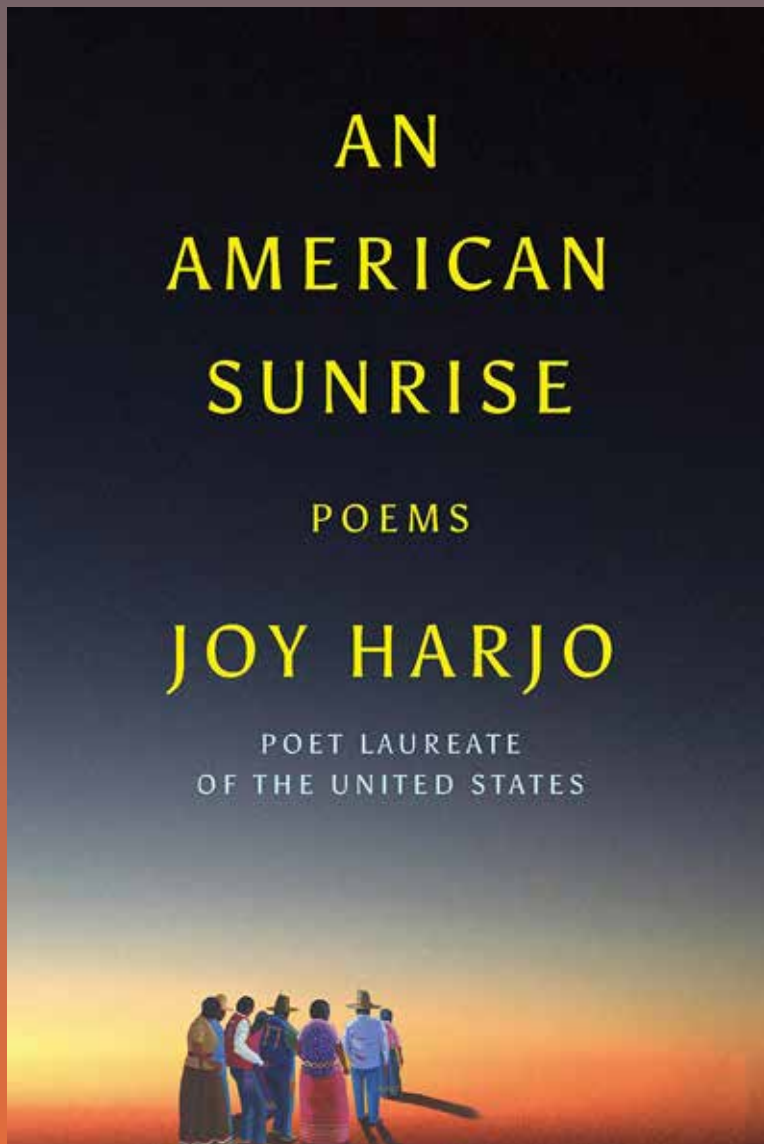

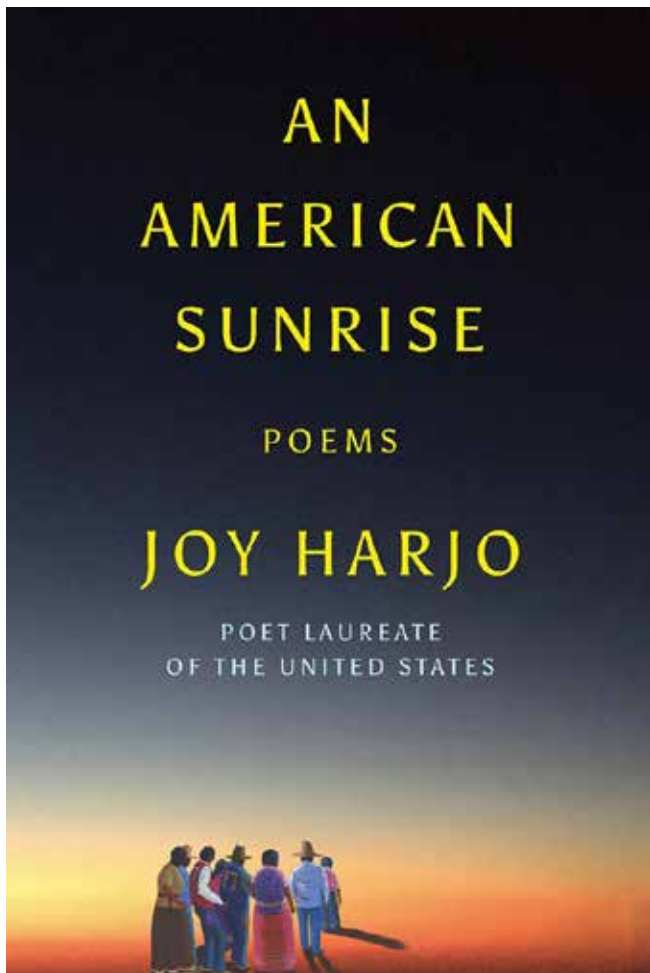

a community read event



Quincy Reads 2021



A collaborative community reading event will come back to Quincy this fall. Quincy Public Library will be presenting Quincy Reads. The goal of Quincy Reads is simple; everyone in the community comes together to read the same book to inspire conversation and discovery. This year

the library has chosen “An American Sunrise” by US Poet Laureate Joy Harjo as the community read title.

In this stunning collection, Joy Harjo finds blessings in the abundance of her homeland and confronts the site where the Mvskoke people, including her ancestors, were forcibly displaced. From her memory of her mother’s death, to her beginnings in the Native rights movement, to the fresh road with her beloved, Harjo’s personal life intertwines with tribal histories to create a space for renewed beginnings.

Copies of the book will be available at kickoff and other activities in

September and October for patrons to add to their home library as long as supplies last. Library users will also have access to the ebook via the Libby app, where the book will be available for unlimited users to checkout.

Quincy Reads Kickoff Saturday, September 18

The month-long event will start with a kickoff on Saturday, September 18, from 10 am to noon at the library. This event is free and open to the public.

National Library Card Sign-up Month

September is Library Card Sign-up Month! Quincy Public Library joins the American Library Association and libraries nationwide to remind parents, caregivers, and students that signing up for a library card is the first step toward academic achievement and lifelong learning. There is nothing more empowering than signing up for your own library card. Through access to technology, media resources, and educational programs, a library card gives students the tools to succeed in the classroom and provides people of all ages opportunities to pursue their dreams and passions.

Do you have friends who don't have library cards? Invite them to sign up during September.



Home Delivery & Senior Services

Quincy Public Library is pleased to expand its senior services in an effort to make the library more accessible for all. The library currently has openings in its Home Delivery Program. This program is open to any Quincy resident who cannot visit the library due to a temporary or permanent disability. The library will deliver books, DVDs, CDs, and books on CD.

QPL has also expanded its collection to include items targeted at adults with Alzheimer's and dementia. The library has added four Reminisce Kits to its collection.

The 1950s Kit includes a slinky, paper dolls, baseball cards, music of the time, and photos. These objects and photos can be memory aids to remember their past. Other kits include a Handyman Kit, Homemakers Kit, and a 1960s Kit. The library also offers books targeted towards those with dementia that include vibrant pictures to provide a sensory experience. The library has also added several hi-lo books to its collection. These books are titles targeted at adults with lower reading levels. School Delivery & Student Ecards

Quincy Public Library will partner with Quincy teachers to provide School Delivery Service again this year. Any teacher in a Quincy public, parochial/private, pre-school, or registered homeschool is eligible to receive this service.

The service includes selecting, delivering, and picking up requested level-appropriate and curriculum-based books or multimedia items. Teachers may come to the library to select materials, or our School Delivery Specialist may do it for you. Teachers also receive



extended loan periods with our teacher card.

The library also provides digital ecards to every student enrolled in the Quincy Public School District #172. These cards grant access to any digital service at QPL, including databases, ebooks, and streaming services. These cards will be given to students through their teachers.

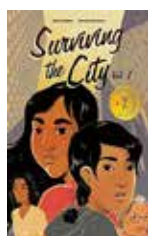

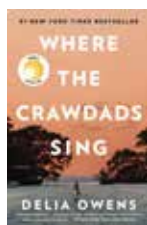

Secondhand Prose sells gently used donated books at low prices to raise the Quincy Public Library funds. Funds are used to supplement the Library budget and for special unbudgeted projects. Over \$313,000 has been raised to support renovations, technology, equipment, and programs and events. Store hours are from 10 am to 7 pm on Tuesdays, and 10 am to 4 pm, Wednesday-Saturday. During October, weekly specials will be announced, and customers will be entered into drawings for a gift basket and gift cards. Loyalty cards will also be available.

October 21-23 in the Large Meeting Room at the library. The sale will be from 9:30 am to 7:30 pm on Thursday and from 9:30 am to 4:30 pm on Friday and Saturday. Books are sold at the clearance price of fifty cents an inch at the sale.
